Sigma Tau Gamma Founder and Fourth National President, Dr. Edward H. McCune, authored Our Creed. In it, he memorialized our founding philosophy that all men are social creatures and that the friendships of college men are lasting ones. He defined our social fraternity as dedicated to the highest ideals of manhood and brotherhood; to congeniality, the development of good personal characteristics and social poise; to good scholarship, mature thinking and action; to good citizenship, democratic principles and acceptance of responsibility; and to loyalty and service to college, community, Fraternity and country. McCune was our philosopher-founder, and upon his philosophy, we established the Principles that guide our Fraternity and this awards program.
